COURSE SYLLABUS

Tchaikovsky was the first Russian composer to attain enduring international fame. He composed some of the most popular concert and theatrical music in the current classical repertoire. His output include symphonies, concertos, operas, ballets, overtures, chamber music, and songs.

Tchaikovsky's personal life was a bewildering succession of tragedies, anxieties, failures, and successes. His greatest fear was that his homosexuality would become public knowledge. In nineteenth-century Russia this would have resulted him becoming a social pariah with a ruined career. It is hardly surprising that many authors have described him as neurotic.

Professor Robert Greenberg delineates the life and music of this beloved figure in a series of eight informative and entertaining lectures. Each 45-minute presentation will be followed by additional examples of Tchaikovsky's compositions. The other five weeks of the semester will be devoted to high-definition videos of his works performed by famous orchestras in various venues.
