Course Title: Charles Dickens & Emile Zola: Britain, France and the Industrial Revolution. Instructor: Susan Turnbull Shoemaker

- 10- coal mining & working conditions in the mines; use of female & child labor in them;
- 11- sexuality, particularly adolescent sexuality;
- 12- agitators and strike actions;
- 13- the role of family;
- 14 the plot of & characters in the two books;
- 15 comparison of the novels: similarities and differences.
